

Pupils resistant to doing Spanish

Subjects Everyone Takes GCSE subjects

- English
- maths
- R.E.
- Science (double award for vast majority)
 Non-GCSE but statutory subjects
- PSHCE(including Citizenship & Careers)
- P.E.

Blue

- Orange
- Purple

Pathways

All core subjects, Spanish, choose history or geography, plus one other (including triple science)

All core subjects, a humanity plus two other choices Small (5-10) number of pupils following core (where appropriate), ASDAN plus enrichment work.

Blue Pathway

- Pupils following EBACC curriculum, includes triple science.
- Pupils study Spanish and choose from history or geography. They then have one further choice which includes a triple science option.
- Pathway for those pupils considering law, medicine and other professions requiring higher education for example at university.

Orange Pathway

- Pupils follow this pathway as it contains elements of more academic subjects but has a greater mix of vocational and practical subjects.
- Pupils choose from history or geography.
- Pupils choose from History/Spanish/Art or IT.
- Pupils have a final choice from 8 subjects.

Allows a wider and more practical blend of subjects.

Purple Pathway

- Our smallest pathway designed for pupils with some additional needs such as life skills and level 1/entry-level English and Maths.
- They should only consider taking history or geography after all IF they are likely to gain at least a grade C AND they believe that they will benefit from the subject.
- This represents only around 10 pupils.

G.C.S.E.s into the future....

They are still two-year courses but have received a lot of content from A-level and so De La Salle has extended Key Stage 4 to 3 years.

There is no longer coursework in most subjects.

All subjects are assessed by exams at the end of the course. There are typically two or three exams per subject.

3 things to take away....

Exams at the end of the course. Courses are changing in content, approach and assessment/grading. Ask your subject teachers for more specific advice.
