I am sure you will join me in welcoming them to our community and wishing them well in their new roles.

Exam Results

There were many success stories in our results over the summer including 34 grade 9s and 115 grade 8s, as well as the gap between boys and girls and the gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged students reducing. I would like to congratulate all of our students and wish them well as they move on to college.

However, I am a firm believer in openness and honesty so I will not pretend that our summer exam results were brilliant. Trying to rectify the issues and disruption of previous years was always going to be a challenge within a year but the results fell well below what we want for our students and what our community expects and deserves. I can assure you that the work we have done over the past year, and are continuing to do, will lead to a rapid rise in GCSE results as we move forward.

INSET Days

Our staff worked hard over the first two INSET days focussing upon:

- ensuring our mission statement is at the heart of all we do.
- building a deeper empathy of students to assist with behaviour management.
- developing triads of teachers to share good practice and further improve the quality of teaching.
- looking at how we are planning to develop the character and culture of the students within the school.

The sessions were very well delivered and staff were enthused by the training they had received.

Flight Paths

Over the next couple of weeks your child will be given his/her flight paths. These are not target grades but rather a measure of the reasonable progress we would expect students to make from their starting point in Year 7 to the end of their GCSE studies. When students begin their GCSE course their flight path will equate to their bronze GCSE target grade.

For students in **Years 10 and Year 11** there will be no change to their flight paths as these are well established.

For students in **Years 7-9** we have used a new, more accurate system to create flight paths based upon the nationally recognised Fischer Family Trust (FFT) expectations, which will compare your child's progress with the top 20% of their cohort nationally.

Students in all three of these year groups will now have four flight paths rather than one single flight path. This will be new to our Year 9 students only, as we moved to the system of four flight paths for our current Year 8 last year. These flight paths are: English, maths, EBACC (science, MFL and humanities) and open (all other subjects).

This means that the students' flightpaths are more accurate and bespoke to their abilities rather than a single flightpath to cover all subjects. As a result, your child may well have the same flight path for all four areas or may have two, three, or on rare occasions four different flight paths. We believe this will allow us to make more accurate assessments of their progress and ensure higher expectations and better outcomes for the students.

If you find your child's flight path has changed, this is not an indication that s(he) is falling behind or not making enough progress; it is simply that we are using a more accurate measure to assess what strong progress would look like in each of the four areas for a student with similar prior attainment.

We are confident that these new measures will support both staff and students in the challenge to achieve the best possible outcomes in all areas at GCSE. If you have any questions regarding this then please contact Mrs Mulhall, Deputy Headteacher.

Open Evening

As we did last year, the students will have an earlier finish for Open Evening on Thursday 4th October. They will have their five lessons but these will be rearranged as below:

As I mentioned at the end of last year, under new regulations, Merseytravel cannot change the bus service times so there will be no early school buses that day but the service will run as normal at 3.00pm if students wish to wait in school for them.

Lockers

Last week I mentioned that Years 8-11 would no longer be using lockers and this led to a number of parents contacting me regarding the matter or asking for part refunds to the £5 paid before joining us in Year 7. There was a lot more to the decision than simply deciding not to have them and I should have shared this with you. Buses/Road Works

Fire Alarms

During this first week, we have had two fire alarms that have led to a full evacuation. The cause, for both of these, has been a fault within the system. Though this has given us the opportunity to complete the required termly evacuations, we are working with the alarm company to ensure the issue is rectified and no further teaching time is lost. The students have been excellent on both occasions.

School Building

Over the summer, we put a lot of effort into smartening the school up for our staff and students, including a thorough deep clean, painting the areas most in need, replacing old or damaged furniture and making the building a place we can all be proud of. A big thank you to the site team for their hard work and efforts and I hope our students recognise the improvements and help keep the school in good shape.
