#### **Aims**

- To offer academic catch-up activities across a range of subjects, including English and Maths, following what had been an interrupted period of education over the past 18 months
- To provide enrichment activities to enhance learning
- To provide Year 7 students with the opportunity to get to know some of their classmates, teachers and the school building
- To support many of our Pupil Premium families during the potentially difficult period of the school holidays

## **Activities**

As a school we were disappointed that we were unable to hold our transition week during first week of July. Therefore, we were very pleased that we could hold a summer school in the holidays and meet our new students who would be joining us in September.

The summer school took place from Monday 26<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

During the week students met the Pastoral Team, Head of Year, Pastoral Support Manager and some of their new teachers and support staff who would be working closely with them when they join us in September.

Maths and English lessons were held every day to help students catch up any work that had been missed, alongside PE, drama, music, Duke of Edinburgh's Award activities and well-being sessions. Students enjoyed ice-breaker activities to meet new friends and their new school chaplain who, in assemblies, reinforced our Lasallian message of inclusivity of our De La Salle community. In the feedback given at the end of week, many students commented on their enjoyment of the break and lunchtime refreshments that were served each day!

On the final day we finished with a celebratory assembly, during which every student received a certificate and many also received prizes for their excellent contributions during the week. We watched slides with photos of the events that had taken place all week and there was a real sense that they were now a year group. We believe our aim to ensure that all students felt part of our community and ready to start in September was successfully fulfilled.
