

Set in the wild, bleak Yorkshire Moors, this masterpiece is considered one of the finest examples of Gothic Literature.








### Teachers' Picks...



16 year-old Hazel meets witty and charming Augustus Waters at a cancer support group. Augustus suffers from a rare type of bone cancer but has recently been given the all-clear. The pair have a crazy adventure travelling to Amsterdam in search of the author of their favourite book, but it is during this romantic trip that their worlds fall apart.

Full of humour and heartbreak, this book will make you laugh, cry and smile.



Lyra Belacqua lives half-wild and carefree among the scholars of Jordan College, with daemon, Pantalaimon, always by her side. But the arrival of her fearsome uncle, Lord Asriel, draws her to the heart of a terrible struggle – a struggle of stolen children, witch clans and armoured bears.

As she hurtles towards danger in the cold, far North, Lyra never suspects the shocking truth: she alone is destined to win, or to lose, the biggest battle imaginable.



This debut novel is narrated by 16 year-old Starr Carter, an African – American from a poor neighbourhood who attends a private school in a predominately white, affluent part of the city. Starr becomes entangled in a national news story after she witnesses a white police officer shoot and kill her childhood friend, Khalil. Now what Starr says could destroy her community. It could also get her killed.

Inspired by the Black Lives Matter movement, this is a powerful and gripping novel about one girl's struggle for justice.

### **Graphic Novels**

Graphic novels are a great way to enjoy reading. There are loads of new titles and many popular and classic novels have been rewritten in this form.

Nimona is an impulsive young shapeshifter with a knack for villainy. Lord Ballister Blackheart is a villain with a vendetta. As sidekick and supervillain, Nimona and Lord Blackheart are about to wreak some serious havoc. Their mission: prove to the kingdom that Sir Ambrosius and his buddies at the Institution of Law Enforcement and Heroics aren't the heroes everyone thinks they are.

But as small acts of mischief escalate into a vicious battle, Lord Blackheart realizes that Nimona's powers are as murky and mysterious as her past. And her unpredictable wild side might be more dangerous than he is willing to admit.





For official purposes, these children do not exist.
















### **Author Robert Muchamore on Cherub**
