HAF

The Holidays and Food Programme is funded by the DfE and aims to support children to eat more healthily, be more active over the school holidays and have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition, as well as be more engaged with school and other local services.

My initial hopes of covering a GCSE history class were sadly dashed as I was allocated 3 Year 8 maths groups (yes that is how tight staffing was that we had to group some classes together).

Fortunately, our maths department are incredibly well organised and within minutes we had all 3 classes working away quietly and conscientiously. My role was keeping it that way. Then the first hand went up. Now I am ashamed to admit that, unlike my wife and two sons who are great mathematicians, my literacy skills are far stronger than my numeracy skills (ironically, I think I started to struggle with maths when we began using letters as well as numbers).

Nevertheless, I was there to serve, so went over to help – sure enough it was an equation: letters and numbers. I could feel that anxiety starting to rise as the student looked up to me for help. My

mind raced back to those many maths lessons in school: think man, think! I can't do it, should I give up, tell the child to move on to the next question?

Then bit by bit it started to come back to me, the logic of moving elements either side of the = sign and how this changed things (I am sure there is a mathematical phrase for that). I started to explain, to myself as much as the student, as the memories returned to me and a minute later the child got it. This was the single biggest achievement I think I have had this year and I am certain I did a little fist pump as I walked back to oversee the students, full of self-satisfaction. Then the next hand went up...
