Attendance



De La Salle School



- Government expectation-97% attendance as a minimum equalling to 5 days
- Parental responsibility for pupils to attend school is a legal requirement
- Unauthorised absences will be dealt with by the Local Authority in the form of fixed penalty notices and court proceedings
- Strong pastoral teams in position to support attendance
- Data and information will be sent regularly
- 90% attendance is considered a persistent absentee

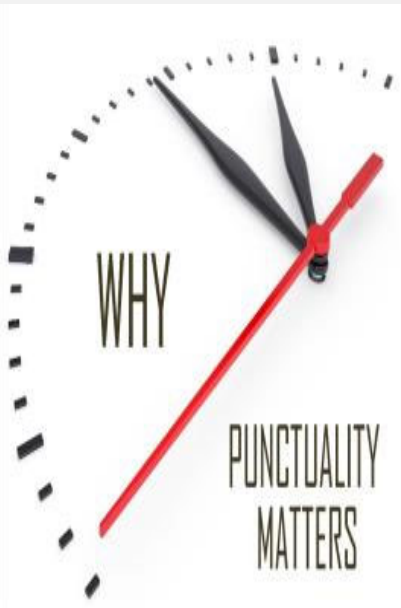


Punctuality



De La Salle School

- School day begins at 8.30 am, pupils to arrive before this
- Students are expected to arrive to lessons on time – transition time
- Late to school twice in a week leads to a lunchtime detention
- Parents are notified about student punctuality to lessons
- Appropriate sanctions will be allocated





Star Points

Award	Star Points
Copper Star	200
Bronze Star	500
Silver Star	700
Gold Star	900
Platinum Star	1100
Diamond Star	1300

- Daily 6 - positive start to the day
- Awarded by teachers for positive behaviour for learning and displaying positive Lasallian values
- Star points lead to a range of rewards
- Rewards include star of the week, vouchers, certificates of achievement, prize draws and postcards home





Behaviour Points

- Any students not following school expectations will have star points removed
- These are categorised as behaviour/standards points
- Lost star points are monitored on a daily basis
- School sanctions then apply – Lasallian Ways





Homework



De La Salle School

- In response to parental feedback the school will now set homework through Edulink – reviewed yearly
- Homework and independent study is set according to the demands of the school curriculum
- Examples include: research, revision, quizzes, reading, comprehension and creative tasks
- Parents will be informed of completion via the Edulink app
- Parents will be notified if students repeatedly don't complete homework via Parentmail and/or phone call





- Login details will be emailed to you for Sept
- Student login details are the same as school network login details (school ID : De La Salle)
- Features include:
 - Star point information
 - Lunchtime purchases
 - Timetable
 - Attendance and punctuality information
 - School reports
 - Homework
