Whole School Focus – School Improvement Partner (SIP)

I mentioned earlier that our School Improvement Partner (SIP) was in school this week. We have recently just changed SIPs and this was Dr Antony Edkins' first visit to the school. I thought it might be useful to share with parents, how the SIP operates and helps with our school improvement.

SIPs are usually very skilled educationalists, with a track record of improvement, and that is the case with Antony who as well as previously being a Headteacher and Chief Executive of a MAT, is also a serving Ofsted inspector. Having met with him, I am confident that he will be a strong and positive force for good on our school improvement journey, as he clearly understood our school, the journey it has been on and what it needs to do to improve further.

As part of their role, SIPs will do the following:

- Advise and challenge headteachers and Senior leaders
- Work in supporting middle leaders
- Carry out the headteacher's performance management
- Broker any additional support with other schools or organisations
- Provide detailed update reports for governors in order to help their understanding of the progress in school.

Yesterday's visit was very positive and he could clearly see the impact of the improvement work we have been doing since the summer.
