Parental Update 1

A warm, welcome back to school to the autumn term and it is very kind of summer to show up as we return to school! The start of term has been an extremely positive one with the students settling back in very well.

To our new Year 7 parents, a special welcome, and I hope that your child is enjoying their first week here at De La Salle. The Year 7s have really impressed with their maturity and positivity so far. As I mentioned in my letter earlier in the week, I will try to write out with a short update at the end of every week and produce a more colourful and detailed newsletter at the end of each term.

Today's update provides a lot of key information about contacts and the year ahead, they aren't normally this full! Along with today's update there is:

- Careers newsletter: we share these weekly and encourage you to discuss with the students
- Term Dates for the year (including an early finishes and INSET days)
- Pastoral Teams for each Year Group
- Canteen menu and pricing

Whole School Focus - School Organisation and Structures

Often the school will receive calls from parents wanting to speak to me directly about an issue, as this is what often happens in a primary school. As I am sure you can imagine, in a school of 1200 students and 150 staff, there are layers of management and leadership who will pick up and address issues and more importantly will know more about them and be better able to help you.

To help you identify who you should contact the key people are highlighted below and attached a list of key contacts:

- 1. For **subject issues**, the **class teacher** will support students helped by their **Head of Department (HOD)**.
- 2. For **pastoral issues**, we have a tiered structure of staff to support students. This structure is different to those in most primary schools as we have far more students. The structure is:
 - Form tutor: this is your child's daily contact for most low-level things in school.
 - Pastoral Support Manager (PSM) or Learning Mentor in Yr 7: the PSMs/LMs deal with the mid-level issues that a student might face and support their Head of Year with the Year Group.
 - Head of Year (HOY) or Pastoral Leader (PL) in Yr 7: the HOYs/ PLs oversee
 the whole year group, pick up the more serious issues and direct the work of the
 PSMs and Form Tutors.
 - Senior Leader (SLT): each Year group is also overseen by a member of the Senior Leadership Team. They deal with the serious issues that arise and oversee the work of the HOY. These are:
 - Year 7 Mrs Jess
 - Years 8 and 9 Mr Hale
 - Years 10 and 11 Ms Flaherty

- **Headteacher:** this is me. I oversee standards across the whole school and all aspects of school life. I generally deal with the high level, whole-school strategic issues rather than individual issues, or at least try to!
- **Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL):** this is Mrs De'Ath and she has ultimate responsibility for the safeguarding of staff and students across the school.
- 3. For **SEND Issues**, our SENDCo is Miss Neill she is overseen by a member of the SLT, Mrs De'Ath.

GCSE Results

We are delighted that this year's GCSE improved even further on last year's and are the best the school has had since the current GCSE system was introduced. The rise was particularly pleasing because it was across almost every subject in the school – showing the impact of our school improvement work over recent years. We wish all of last year's Year 11 students well as they begin their college courses and apprenticeships.

Canteen

Can parents please ensure that their child has money on their accounts if they are using the canteen at break or lunchtime? We have had a number of students so far this term, from all year groups, who have not had money to buy their food. Obviously, we have ensured that the students receive a lunch, but ask parents to check their child's balance regularly. I have also attached a copy of the menu and pricing for parents' information. You can also check what your child has purchased via Edulink.

Uniform and Lateness to Lessons

I know some parents will think – why is he banging on about this again? The answer is simple – besides the financial/peer pressures and bullying those issues like shoe brands can cause, they have a real impact upon attitude in lessons and around school, helping to create a sense of belonging and commitment to our Lasallian family – Belong is one of the 5 core values that underpin our school. In other words, these are the basic foundations upon which we can then deliver a strong education. We are keen for young people to express their individuality, but through something that comes from within: their writing, art, performance and sporting skills rather than expensive items and add-ons such as clothing, dyed hair or piercings.

Year 7 Retreats and Welcome Mass

Our Year 7 students will soon be having their retreat. The theme: Touching Hearts - helps students to understand that at the core of our mission here at De La Salle we are each called to reach out and create heart to heart connections with those in our community. These will be taking place on Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th October for the JOHN forms, and Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th October for the BDLS forms.

At the end of that week on Friday 11th October we will be having a Year 7 Welcome Mass at 2:00pm in Main Hall, parents are welcome to join us - arriving via the Mill Brow gate and the De La Salle grey gate on the right (please be aware we have very limited parking in the school). 
